4515a	mummified human remains	Egypt	<p>Mummified remains of a woman, wrapped in many layers of linen and partially unwrapped at the head and feet. Around the head, much of the wrappings have been removed entirely, with cut layers left exposed around the neck. On the lower half of the face, deeper layers of solid, resin coated wrappings have been exposed. These extend around the sides of the face and the back of the head. The Upper half of the head has been completely exposed revealing the darkened skull beneath. At the top of the head some of the hair remains.
